As pointed out to me by Martha McGinnis, this definition only works correctly in trees that are binary branching. If more branches are allowed, then the sisters to the governor block government further lower in the tree. Government was primarily used at a time when X-bar theory (see chapter 7) was prevalent and X-bar theory uses binary branching trees.
